When

- Before, during, and after preparing food
- Before eating food
- Before and after caring for someone who is sick
- Before and after treating a cut or wound
- After using the toilet, changing diapers, or cleaning up a child who has used the toilet
- After blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing
- After touching an animal, animal feed, or animal waste
- After touching garbage

How

- Use warm, clean water
- Moisten hands and apply soap
- Rub hands together. Lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers and under your nails
- Scrub your hands for at least 20 seconds (hum "Happy Birthday" from beginning to end twice)
- Rinse thoroughly with clean, running water
- Dry hands with a clean towel or air dry them
- No soap and water? Rub an alcohol-based sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol over your hands and fingers until they are dry.
