# Penn Fed holds successful 23rd Convention

**T**he BMWED Pennsylvania Federation held its 23rd Regular Quadrennial Convention August 6- 8 in Atlantic City, N.J. The Penn Fed convened for two days, swearing in newly elected officers, conducting the membership's business, adopting bylaws and resolutions, and setting the federation's course for the next four years.

The convention was chaired by recently elected General Chairperson Anthony Sessa. BMWED Vice President and former Penn Fed General Chairperson, Jed Dodd, remarked "the torch has been passed to Anthony Sessa. Anthony Sessa is a man who lives the qualities of solidarity, sacrifice and love every day in our struggle for justice."

The delegation was addressed by numerous guest speakers including BMWED President Freddie N. Simpson and Secretary-Treasurer David D. Joynt, along with several other advocates of the Labor Movement. Several Pennsylvania Federation retirees spoke on the importance of being an active and proud Union member. Long-time Penn Fed Vice Chairperson George Davidson remarked to members and guests in attendance, "I am confident that this 132-year-old Union, with its affiliations with the Teamsters International Union, will continue to be a leader in the Union movement on America's railroads, as well as the other industries it represents. Our collective strength is in our ability to unite around the issues which are most important to us: healthcare, pensions, and wages, that will remain as priorities in our future contracts. Our priority is to stay focused, to support our Union leaders, and our members in Solidarity." The retirees were honored with resolutions passed on their behalf. Several retiring Vice Chairman, Executive Board members and staff were recognized for their service to the Union.

During the convention, the Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employees was honored and recognized by the City of Philadelphia for its work and fierce advocacy on Philadelphia's successful Fair Workweek Campaign. Vice President Jed Dodd explained, "There was a point in time in which this piece of legislation was in jeopardy, and they were

going to try and kill it in a committee hearing. The people who were supporting fair work week asked if we could provide some muscle for the demonstrations in the city council meeting. Mick Barrett from CRSF brought his people, Anthony Sessa from the Pennsylvania Federation brought his people, and

President Simpson asked National Division people to attend the meeting as well. And those city council meeting people actually credit our militancy in that meeting with backing down the opponents of the Fair Workweek legislation and letting it get passed through city council." ## General Counsel Bill Bon Retires

William A. "Bill" Bon, longtime BMWED General Legal Counselor, retired this summer, ending a venerable and respected tenure as our Union's chief attorney.

Brother Bon was hired as BMWED General Counsel in 1987, following a short stint as a labor attorney at Gallon, Kalniz and Iorio in Toledo, Ohio. Prior to his role at the law firm, Brother Bon was the President of United Auto Workers Local 122 in Twinsburg, Ohio from 1984-1987.

In recent years, many BMWED members recognize Brother Bon for his educational presentations and guidance with the Internal Organizing department, many lectures centering around explaining the Railway Labor Act. His speeches on Dr. John R. Boyd, a United States military strategist and his theories and their relevance to the Labor Movement resonated with members.

In his 32-year career with the Brotherhood, Brother Bon worked as the sole attorney in the BMWED Legal Department, handling federal litigation at both the National Division and at the system division levels. He also participated at various times in national bargaining, presenting before Presidential Emergency Boards 219, 221, 222, 229, and 234.

Brother Bon was very proud of his Labor roots. His grandfathers were coal miners, his mother a grocery store cashier, his father a steel worker. Brother Bon was hired at Chrysler as a production worker at the Twinsburg stamping plant on July 5, 1976. While working full-time on the line, he completed his law school studies at the University of Akron and, in 1984, unseated the sitting president of UAW Local 122.

"Brother Bill was with us for a long time and our Brotherhood will forever retain the impression he made on its behalf," President Freddie N. Simpson said. "He remains a fighter for Labor, Unionism, democracy for the people and the dignity and power of workers near and far. We are a better Brotherhood for having him in it and I wish Brother Bill a long, healthy, and happy retirement."

## FEDERAL APPEALS COURT RULES AGAINST BMWED IN PHYSICAL TRACK INSPECTION DECISION

A federal appeals court has ruled against the BMWED in our attempt to require BNSF to perform full visual human-conducted track inspections at the bare minimum requirement of FRA standards.

Judges from the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit denied our petition against the FRA, allowing for BNSF to curtail physical track inspection to twice monthly in order to test new unmanned inspection technology.

Ruling on the BMWED's appeal, two judges maintained that the FRA's decision to grant BNSF a temporary suspension of the track safety standards described in 49 CFR § 213.233(c) "is necessary to the conduct of a ... test program," "is limited in scope and application to such relief as may be necessary to facilitate the conduct of the test program," and "is conditioned on the observance of standards sufficient to assure safety."

We disagree that reducing the frequency of physical track inspections by trained and qualified Track Inspectors is "necessary" to test the capabilities of machine track inspection equipment. We disagree that manually inspecting track twice monthly is sufficient to assure public safety. Just a few years ago, BNSF was boasting about its inspection and derailment prevention measures, making certain to note that the



company inspects "above the frequency required by the FRA," noting that the company inspected "key routes...four times per week and the busiest main lines are inspected daily."

Track inspectors not only take measurements, they assess a variety of interrelated track and right-of-way conditions and make judgments about the cumulative impact of all the conditions they observe; something the machines cannot do. And until the capabilities of the machines are actually evaluated, tracks will be inspected less frequently than is required by Federal track safety regulations.

As we noted publicly immediately following the decision, we want our members to track

# A HELPING HAND

## *Financial Assistance for Families of Deceased Railway Employees*

The John Edgar Thomson Foundation, established in 1882 and endowed by the will of Mr. Thomson, third President of the Pennsylvania Railroad, offers limited financial assistance to daughters of a deceased parent. The parent, regardless of gender, must have been in the active employ of a railroad in the United States at the time of death. The cause of death need not be work-related and the parent, while on the active role of the railroad, may have been receiving disability or sick leave benefits. Whatever grant is awarded usually serves to benefit all members of the family. Eligibility is dependent upon the daughter and surviving parent remaining unmarried.

The monthly allowance made under the grant may cover the period from infancy to age 18, under certain circumstances to age 24, to assist grantees who are pursuing higher educational goals. The Foundation also offers special health care benefits.

The funding for the work of the Foundation is completely independent of any railroad. It neither solicits nor receives funds from the public. Further information and applications may be obtained by writing to:

# Hoffa: 2020 Presidential Candidates Must Share Vision for Labor

The 2020 presidential election, now less than a year away, is arriving at a key moment in U.S. history. Workers, long the backbone of this nation, are falling behind because they've been ignored at the expense of corporations. Next November's vote is an opportunity to change that and pave a path to prosperity.

Preserve our hard-earned pension benefits; continue to protect our legally-guaranteed rights to bargain in good faith; and enact fair trade deals that take workers' issues under consideration.

Using that information, this union is training its members and sending them out on the campaign trail all across the country to get presidential contenders on the record about what they will do to fix pensions, strengthen collective bargaining and ensure fair trade.

The Teamsters have also gotten seven current presidential candidates thus far to do sit down interviews addressing those issues. And we've built a website —[www.teamstersvote.com](http://www.teamstersvote.com)— where people can go and get answers directly from the mouths of the candidates themselves.

Our members can't be easily won. Their voices, and the voices of all American workers, must be heard. That is why we have asked all of the candidates, Democrats and Republicans, to make several serious commitments to receive consideration.

Besides sitting down for interviews, the Teamsters are asking candidates to sign our pledge to support legislation that protects pensions and retirement security, strengthens the ability of workers to join a union and establishes a new trade policy that protects



working people. Ten current Democratic presidential candidates have already signed.

It is not enough for candidates just to say that they stand with working people. The Teamsters will be inviting them to join us in action fighting on the front lines. The union has asked all candidates to partner with us in support of workers, whether at a strike line, an organizing committee meeting or any other true show of solidarity.

Candidates who fulfill all the requirements will be eligible to receive the Teamsters' support. Ahead of a union endorsement, the union leadership will poll membership and survey local union leadership. From there, the General Executive Board, at the recommendation of the general president will, or will not, make an endorsement.

This union is optimistic that those seeking the highest office in the land are ready to stand with workers.

inspect. It is our work, we are the best at it, and our professionalism is in the public's best interest. BMWED members are the most-qualified and most-skilled railroad track inspectors and their expertise should not be subverted by an unproven and experimental technology.

The BMWED wants American railroads to be safe. To have a set of human eyes inspect for defects. To know that the train your friend or family member is riding on won't derail or the tankers that are pulling through your neighborhood will stay upright. We want a person, trained and personally-familiar with their section of the railroad, responsible for keeping us safe.

Every bit of this process reeks of its true intentions: using technology to replace skilled workers to boost corporate profits. It's not about advancing rail safety – it's about making money. This administration promised to bring back jobs. Yet its FRA and appointees to federal court can't even retain the ones we have. If you want to determine if the technology works, it should be done as a supplemental inspection and followed closely and frequently by BMWED member professionals, who know their assigned track like the back of their hand. This is a bad decision for rail workers and a bad decision for the country at large. We are and will remain in opposition of this decision.

**BMWED MEMBERS STAND WITH THE UAW DURING ITS SUCCESSFUL STRIKE**

**B**MWED Brothers and Sisters nationwide stood with United Auto Workers members on strike at General Motors early this fall. Their fight against GM's greed was and is our fight too. It is every working persons' battle, because without the gumption and courage shown by strikers, corporations would bleed labor dry.

Sadly, this is not a new struggle. The UAW has struck GM before. In 1937, newly-formed union workers walked out of GM factories in Flint, Michigan over brutally unfair workplace practices and low wages. But the company wasn't sitting idly by. GM appealed to the police, who responded with predictable force. They arrived at Fisher Plant No. 2 on January 11 with guns and tear gas. They hurled the tear gas into the barricaded plant, and fired bullets at every moving shape they laid eyes on.

But the occupying strikers were both militant and clever: they had covered the windows with metal sheets and punched holes in them, through which they poked the nozzles of fire hoses. They stood off against the police for six hours, and while fourteen

strikers were injured, the police eventually withdrew. And eventually, the Union workers prevailed.

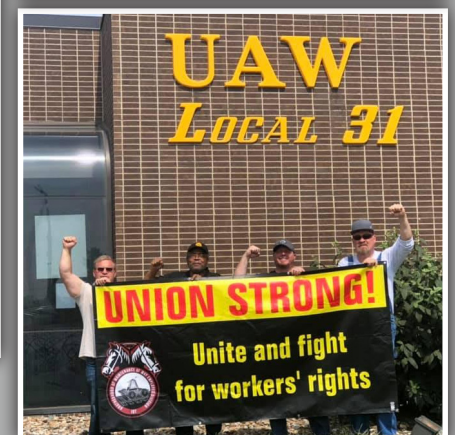
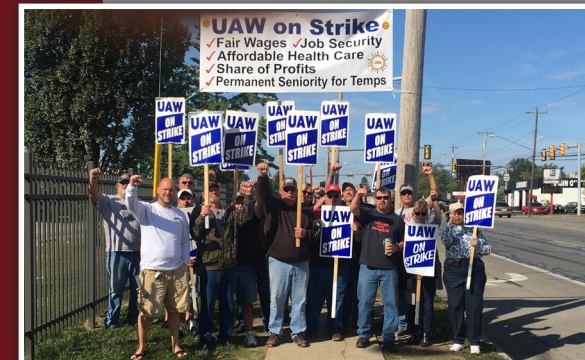
Since then, there have been other strikes between the UAW and the Big Three automakers. It always boils down to the same, tired, despicable root. Companies attempting to squeeze every last cent of profit out of the laborers' work.



Always remember that GM CEO Mary Barra makes \$22 million annually. Remember that the UAW simply wanted GM to hire its employees and not just bring them on – permanently – as temps. They wanted affordable health insurance to stay affordable. They wanted a piece of the record-setting corporate tax decreases to trickle down to the assembly line workers. They wanted fairness.

If you are a furloughed employee of a railroad covered by the U.S. National Agreement with at least 60 days of seniority or 60 calendar days of continuous service preceding a covered holiday, and if you had compensation paid by the carrier credited to 11 or more of the 30 calendar days immediately preceding the holiday, you may be entitled to pay for that holiday even though you are furloughed.



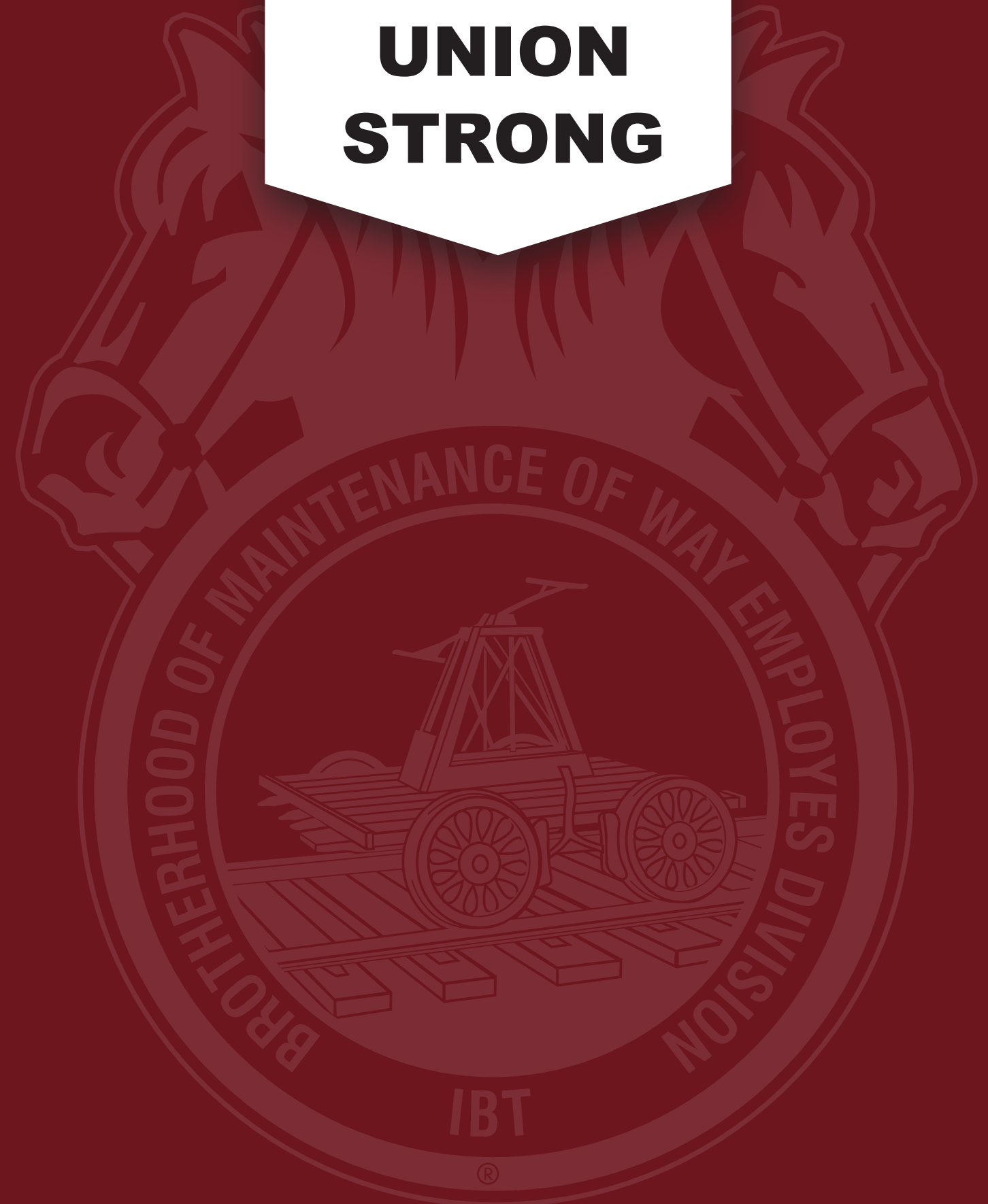

## RAILROAD RETIREMENT BENEFITS WILL INCREASE IN 2020



**M**ost railroad retirement annuities, like social security benefits, will increase in January 2020 due to a rise in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) from the third quarter of 2018 to the corresponding period of the current year.

Cost-of-living increases are calculated in both the tier I and tier II benefits included in a railroad retirement annuity. Tier I benefits, like social security benefits, will increase by 1.6 percent, which is the percentage of the CPI rise. Tier II benefits will go up by 0.5 percent, which is 32.5 percent of the CPI increase. Vested dual benefit payments and supplemental annuities also paid by the Railroad Retirement Board (RRB) are not adjusted for the CPI change.

In January 2020, the average regular railroad retirement employee annuity will increase \$36 a month to \$2,875 and the average of combined benefits for an employee and spouse will increase \$50 a month to \$4,174. For those aged widow(er)s eligible for an increase, the average annuity will increase \$20 a month to \$1,428. However, widow(er)s whose annuities are being paid under the Railroad Retirement and Survivors' Improvement Act of 2001 will not receive annual cost-of-living adjustments until their annuity amount is exceeded by the amount that would have been paid under prior law, counting all interim cost-of-living increases otherwise payable. Almost 52 percent of the widow(er)s on the RRB's rolls are being paid under the 2001 law.

If a railroad retirement or survivor annuitant also receives a social security or other government benefit, such as a public service

pension, any cost-of-living increase in that benefit will offset the increased tier I benefit. However, tier II cost-of-living increases are not reduced by increases in other government benefits. If a widow(er) whose annuity is being paid under the 2001 law is also entitled to an increased government benefit, her or his railroad retirement survivor annuity may decrease.

However, the total amount of the combined railroad retirement widow(er)'s annuity and other government benefits will not be less than the total payable before the cost-of-living increase and any increase in Medicare premium deductions.

The cost-of-living increase follows a tier I increase of 2.8 percent in January 2019, which had been the largest in 7 years. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services will announce Medicare Part B premiums for 2020 later this year, and this information is available at [www.medicare.gov](http://www.medicare.gov).

In late December the RRB will mail notices to all annuitants providing a breakdown of the annuity rates payable to them in January 2020.

## Mandatory Electronic Filing of DOL Report Forms LM-3 and LM-4 REMINDER

The U.S. Department of Labor has made Electronic Filing of Forms LM3 and LM-4, Labor Organization Annual Reports, MANDATORY beginning April 1, 2018. As of that date, the Department of Labor will no longer accept paper reports. All LM reports filed by local lodges will also need to be signed electronically by the Lodge Secretary-Treasurer and President. If one or both of those positions in the lodge are vacant, another lodge officer(s) will need to sign the report electronically. To sign a report electronically, you must first obtain a Username and Password on the Department of Labor website. The Username and Password that you obtain will not expire and will remain in effect as long as you are a lodge officer.

At this time, we are requesting that all Lodge Secretary / Treasurers and Presidents go to the Department of Labor website and obtain their Username and Password if they have not done so already. Go to [www.olms.dol.gov](http://www.olms.dol.gov). Click on "Electronic Forms System (EFS)" in the "OLMS Highlights" section and proceed to "Access the OLMS EFS". Click on "Register for an EFS User ID and Password" and follow the instructions.

Do not obtain a Union Pin at this time. Be sure to keep your Usernames and Passwords in a safe place so that they are available when it is time to sign the LM report. If you wish to provide your Username and Password to National Division Headquarters, we will keep them on file in case they are lost or misplaced. A copy of the form shown below will be provided by regular mail to all lodge Secretary-Treasurers in early April.
