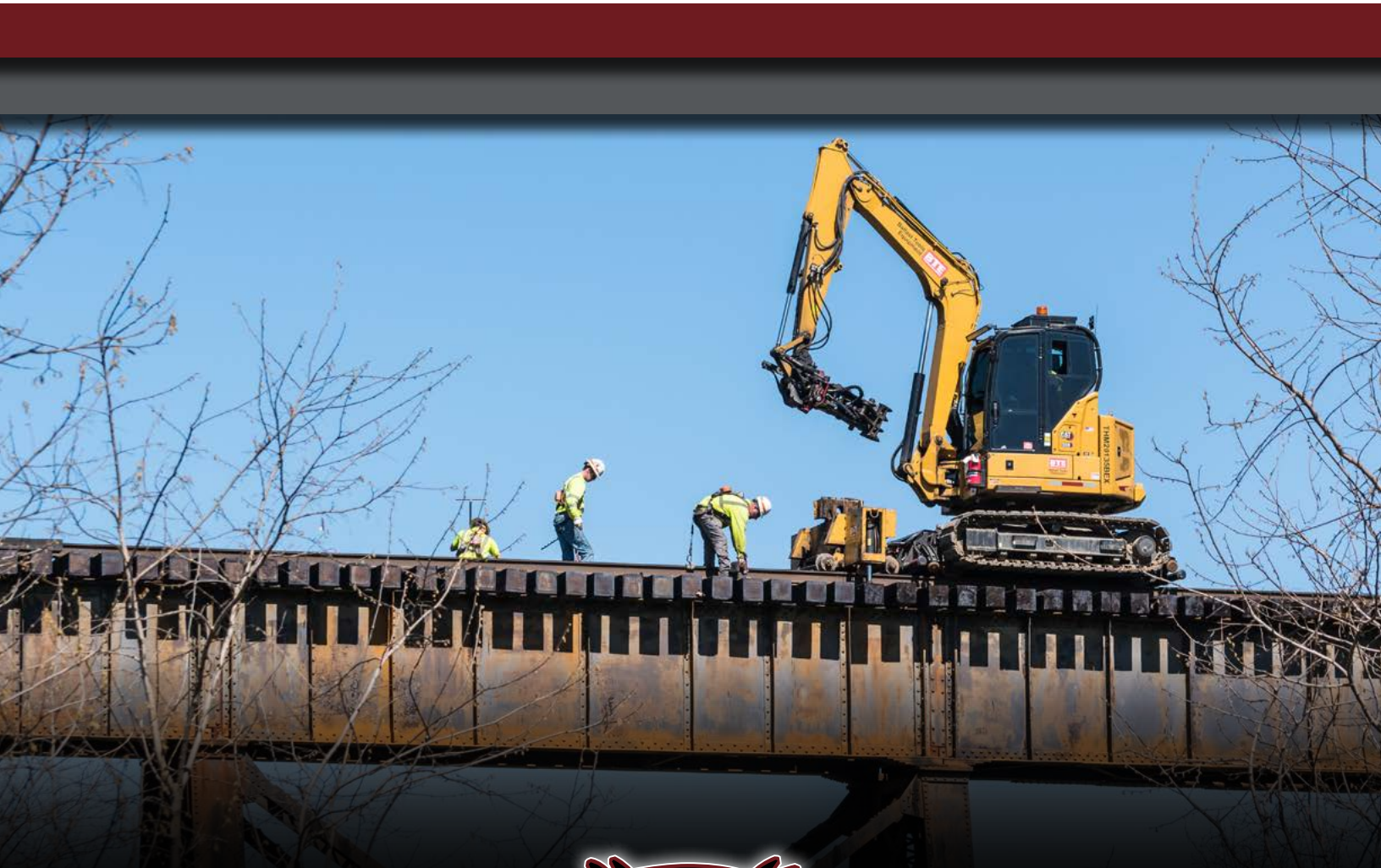

BMWED ARSF CONVENTION RE-ELECTS LONG, CHARTS FUTURE COURSE FOR FEDERATION

Delegates at the first quadrennial convention of the BMWED's American Rail System Federation re-elected General Chairman Johnny Long to a four-year term at the helm of the federation Sept. 10 and 11 in Nashville, Tenn.

In addition to re-electing Brother Long, delegates elected the remaining ARSF officers and executive board members to new terms, charted the course of the federation, and prepped for upcoming issues surrounding potential merger/acquisitions in the rail industry and regulatory matters under review.

"Our Federation represents some of the greatest skilled and committed professionals in the railroad industry and I am honored to be a part of what this Federation has accomplished

in such a short span of time," General Chairman Long said.

"As a 30-year railroader, I only imagined that one day every Member would be lodged in hotels rather than unsafe camp cars, that Members would be reimbursed for actual mileage instead of an insufficient travel allowance, that fair per diem rates for meals would become the standard, that paid sick days would be provided in order for our members to take care of their health needs, or that a Federation would ratify an agreement with a Class I Railroad ahead of a moratorium. These things are now a reality and evidence of what hard work and dedication can accomplish. Keep in mind, these things were not just merely given but fought for and if we want to continue to see change we (as officers and rank-and-file Members) need to be willing to fight.," Brother Long added.

Several guests spoke to the delegation on many issues facing our Union, highlighted by Teamster General President Sean M. O'Brien and BMWED President Tony D. Cardwell, who both referenced a growing and burgeoning collaboration within the Teamster Rail Conference that is bearing fruit.

"I always looked at the Rail Division as a real opportunity to protect, preserve and improve the lives of our Rail Teamster members," General President O'Brien said. "I know for a fact that by providing the necessary resources we have seen organizing growth in the Rail Division, the addition of new members to both the BMWED and BLET, the strength of our political action to protect Railroad Retirement and other vital resources, and the muscle of our contract campaigns to fight for sick leave and other membership gains. I am very excited about the direction of the Rail Division."

BMWED President Cardwell echoed Brother O'Brien's sentiments, noting that it is the members that have been the most instrumental in combating the railroads ill-conceived plans, like automated track inspection deregulation.

"We travel across the country to campaign against this stupid push to reduce visual safety inspection of track and it was that testimony of so many of you all that is leading our fight," President Cardwell said. "Because who knows the most about track inspection? The Track Inspectors! Not some bureaucrat in D.C. Not some arrogant lawyer who thinks he knows because he read about it."

"I believe we are going to win on this issue because of the members and their support. And I commend the Teamsters, who have provided an immense amount of support. They have been a loud voice in D.C."

With that, the convention drew to a close, but not without much collaboration, discussion and fellowship. We wish much success to the newly-elected officers and leadership and look forward to a successful upcoming four years.

Sixth Regular Convention of the Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employees Division - IBT

The Sixth Regular Convention of the Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employees Division of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters will be held June 22 - 24, 2026, at the Sheraton Grand Chicago Riverwalk in Chicago, IL. More information will be provided as the Convention dates approach.

BMWED Bylaws, Article I, Sections 5 and 6

Sec. 5. The National Division shall convene in regular Convention in the month of June, quadrennially, at a time and date and in such city as may be determined by the National Division President and National Division Secretary-Treasurer jointly, with the approval of the National Division Executive Board.

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the BMWED in all cases to which they are applicable and provided they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws and any special rules of order the BMWED may adopt.

Sec. 6. At each regular Convention of the National Division, delegates shall be entitled to cast one vote for every member in good standing of the membership which he represents. Each National Division Officer shall be a delegate ex officio but he may not participate in the election of National Division Officers.

BMWED BRINGS RAIL UNIONS AND LAWMAKERS TOGETHER FOR RAIL SAFETY ROUNDTABLE NEAR EAST PALESTINE, OH



On Saturday, July 19, 2025, the Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employees Division (BMWED), alongside fellow rail unions BLET, BRS, TCU, IAM, and TWU, gathered in Columbiana, OH, 20 miles outside of East Palestine, to raise awareness about the rail industry's dangerous push to cut back on critical human track and equipment inspections.

In the morning, rail union leadership with rank-and-file members present, had the opportunity to meet with Congressman Michael Rulli (R-OH) and Congressman Chris Deluzio (D-PA), both of whom represent districts affected by the devastating Norfolk Southern derailment in East Palestine, OH. Congressman Rulli spoke candidly about his experience on the ground in the immediate aftermath of the derailment — the chaos, leadership in the face of instability, and the lingering health effects he personally experienced in the weeks that followed.

BMWED President Tony Cardwell used the meeting to directly raise concerns about a dangerous waiver request submitted by the Association of American Railroads (AAR) to the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA). The waiver would reduce federally required visual track inspections from twice a week to just twice a month and allow railroads up to 72 hours to repair known defects versus the current requirement that human track inspectors start remediating a known defect immediately.

Both members of Congress were engaged and clearly concerned about the consequences of removing the human element from rail safety. President Cardwell and other labor representatives made it clear that while rail labor welcomes the best available technology, it must

be used alongside, not instead of, skilled human inspections to ensure the safety of workers and the communities they travel through.

Congressmen Rulli and Deluzio reiterated their commitment to advancing rail safety legislation and outlined the complex legislative landscape through which these bills must be navigated in order to secure passage. Both members highlighted the need for Congress to pass H.R. 928, their bipartisan Railway Safety Act of 2025. That BMWED endorsed legislation would make important improvements to rail safety and address some of the issues highlighted in the East Palestine derailment.

Nearly two and half years after the Norfolk Southern train derailment, guys like me and Rep. Rulli are not giving up on the fight to make rail safer,” said Congressman Deluzio. “I refuse to let my community and workers be treated like collateral damage in the way of railroad profits. Our roundtable discussion with union rail workers, union representatives, and community leaders was productive; rest assured we have the fire in our bellies to see this fight through.”

Later that afternoon, the rail unions held a community town hall with residents from East Palestine and the surrounding areas, continuing the conversation with those residents directly impacted.

“We have to keep reminding (the railroads) of what happened. We have to keep reminding them of their promises and obligations,” President Cardwell said. “The railroads aren’t going to grow a conscience. So, our job is to remind the people that can control these issues, that can pass laws, that this can be done. Perseverance will win in this.”

The audacity of the railroads was perhaps best explained by BMWED member Joseph Roberts, an employee of Norfolk Southern who was one of many that worked the East Palestine derailment and now suffers health ailments because of chemical exposure. Despite that catastrophe, the carriers show no shame or remorse, insisting on implementing fewer visual safety inspections in lieu of unproven, cost-cutting measures like ATI.

“We already have enough derailments,” Brother Roberts said. “If (the railroads) get this through, East Palestine is coming to a community near you.”





BMWED TRACK INSPECTOR HAILED AS HERO AFTER RESCUING DROWNING MAN!

In July, Brothers Paul Clawges (Track Inspector) and Barry Sanders (Machine Operator), both members of the Conrail System Federation Local Lodge 0305, were on storm patrol during a flash flood emergency around Piscataway, NJ, when they were dispatched to respond to a downed power line.

Upon arrival, they spotted a man face down in the nearby floodwaters. When they checked on him, he was unresponsive. Without hesitation, Brother Clawges, a former lifeguard and CPR-certified Conrail employee, got into the water, pulled the man to safety, and began performing CPR.

“He was not lifting his head, and he stopped moving, and there was nothing, so that’s when I just jumped in,” Clawges said. “I just picked him up, dragged him out and started doing CPR.”

After more than three minutes of CPR, the man began breathing again.

“I didn’t think I was going to be able to get him, but we got him breathing,” Clawges said.

We’re incredibly proud of Brothers Clawges and Sanders, courageous members of the BMWED. Moments like these remind us of the special breed Maintenance of Way employees are, always looking out for one another and for the communities we move through every day — just doing what railroaders do.

President's PERSPECTIVE

Navigating a Pivotal Moment in Rail: Mergers, Leadership Shifts, and the Fight for Worker Protections

The whirlwind circumstances within the rail industry today feel like a momentous milestone. Union Pacific's proposed acquisition of Norfolk Southern, now under federal review, is arguably the most significant consolidation effort in modern rail history. Additionally, CSX parted ways with CEO Joe Hinrichs, just a few years into his tenure, in what could be a precursor to a protentional transaction of their own.

The Senate recently confirmed President Trump's nominee to lead the Federal Railroad Administration, the former President and CEO of Pan Am Railway David Fink. His appointment comes at a time when the agency faces critical policy decisions that will shape the future of rail safety and technology.

As our industry continues to evolve, BMWED remains fully engaged with carrier management and regulatory agencies. We are advocating for policies that

preserve the integrity of our craft and ensure the workers are represented at every level of decision-making.

BMWED officers held recent meetings with carrier officials and have additional sessions scheduled in the weeks ahead. During these discussions, we have firmly outlined our expectations for how any future acquisitions or operational changes must impact our members. We will continue to advocate for strong job protections and insist that the interests of our members are not only safeguarded, but advanced.

We are confident that we have made advancements in this regard. Our meetings with carrier management have been constructive. We are confident that good faith conversations are happening and that the voice of the worker is being heard.

It is imperative that the rail industry grows in concert with the employees and that any

future mergers, should they happen, strengthen the industry by bringing in more protected work opportunities and prosperity for our members.

In that regard, we have met with and continue to meet with government officials, including representatives of the White House, to ensure that the highest levels of government understand what is at stake. Railroad employees who face major job changes deserve more than reassurances. Brothers and Sisters, you deserve accountability and respect for the essential role you play in the national economy. The Teamsters, and the leadership of President Sean O' Brien the BMWED and the BLET maintain a strong presence in Washington, and our concerns are heard and considered at every level of policymaking.

In the months ahead, we fully expect all these situations to evolve. The UP/NS merger application will be filed with the Surface Transportation Board soon and we will participate in that process. We will diligently work to identify opportunities to improve the financial and protective conditions of our members on those two properties and will demand that any operational changes affecting quality of life or job security be subject to meaningful consultation with the union.

Regarding developments at the FRA, our ongoing campaign against the unchecked expansion of automated track inspection remains a top priority. We have consistently demonstrated that the expertise and knowledge BMWED track inspectors possess is irreplaceable in ensuring the safety of rail operations.

Technology will continue to shape the future of the rail industry and the world. However, our position is clear: innovation must enhance safety and respect the knowledge of skilled BMWED employees. While technology is a valuable tool, its complexity often conceals long-term risks that may not be immediately apparent. The BMWED will ensure that policymakers fully understand these implications and that the professional track inspectors expertise remains central to rail safety.

This is a pivotal moment for the rail industry. It did not arrive unexpectedly, and the BMWED-IBT is prepared. More importantly, we are confident. We stand in the arena armed with truth, experience, and the determination to protect and advance the interest of all BMWED members.

However, the real strength of our union lies not in titles, offices, or advocacy; **it lies in you**, the members who build, maintain, and protect the nation's rail infrastructure every day. The course ahead will be shaped by your voices, your vigilance, and your unity. Together, we will ensure that the future of this industry is built by those who know how to build and maintain the best.

Our success in these endeavors will be your credit.

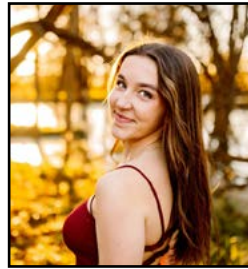

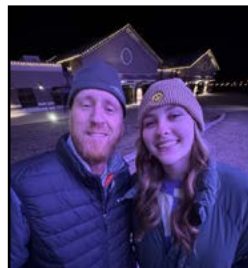

Policy for Distributing Campaign Material at Candidates' Expense – Starting 75 Days before the First Day of the 2026 Convention.

The BMWED National Division maintains this policy, allowing bona fide candidates in National Division Officer Elections to request that the National Division distribute the candidates' campaign literature using the National Division's membership list, including its email list, at the candidates' expense. The National Division has delegated the task of distributing such campaign literature to the American Arbitration Association (AAA). In fulfilling this task, the BMWED National Division and its agent, AAA, assumes **no** responsibility for any of the contents of the candidates' campaign literature, including the literature's factual content. Likewise, the distribution of such campaign literature does **not** constitute any endorsement whatsoever, expressed or implied, by the BMWED National Division or its agent, AAA, of any candidate or slate of candidates for election to office in the BMWED National Division Officers Election.

The AAA will charge a rate of \$350.00 per distribution for each **CONVENTION DELEGATE** electronic mailing (mailing list of delegates provided to AAA by BMWED National Division and not exceeding 500 recipients) and must be paid before communication is sent. Email communication with the entire membership will need to be handled on a case-by-case basis, with fees agreed upon between the candidate and the AAA. Hard Copy distribution will be by agreement between the Candidate/Candidates and AAA, and must be paid before the communication is sent. All materials to be distributed must be in pdf file format.

All mailings and email communications must be received by AAA no less than one week before being distributed. Please note that all electronic Campaign literature will come from the same email address, AAAElections@adr.org, which may end up in a junk mail folder and each recipient will have the right to reject future communications. Neither BMWED National Division nor AAA will be liable in these cases. Moreover, you should be fully aware that not every member shares or updates their email address and contact information with the Brotherhood, and the BMWED National Division can only provide AAA with the most up-to-date information in our system, which will be used for these communications.

Once the campaign period begins, if you desire to distribute campaign literature in connection with the BMWED National Division Officers' election, please contact **Kenneth Egger** at the American Arbitration Association at eggerk@adr.org.

When contacting the AAA, explain that you are a candidate in the BMWED-IBT BMWED National Division Officer Elections and that you would like to disseminate campaign literature. The election campaign distribution will last for 75 days starting Wednesday, April 8, 2026. The last communications will go out on June 9, 2026, and thus must be received by the American Arbitration Association no later than June 2, 2026.

As a reminder, there is a prohibition against using union and employer funds (including cash, facilities, equipment, supplies, and time paid for by the union or employer) to support any person's candidacy in a union officer election. Additionally, nothing in this policy restricts any rights of members and candidates to review membership-related data as allowed by the National Division Bylaws.

NOTE: * The Maximum number of delegates allowed to vote in elections will not exceed 500 because fewer than 500 local lodges are active.

**BMWED/IBT ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE, BE NOMINATED OR BE ELECTED TO
UNION OFFICE**

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

QUESTION 1: I've heard that since we are now under the Teamster's eligibility for elections, twenty-four (24) months of Continuous Good Standing (i.e., continuous timely dues payments) are required to be nominated and elected for office, is this true?

ANSWER 1: Yes. For members of local lodges in existence for more than 24 months, 24 months "Continuous Good Standing" is required.

For members of newly-chartered local lodges in existence for less than 24 months, the provisions of Article II, Section 4(b) of the IBT Constitution would apply.

QUESTION 2: How are the twenty four (24) months of Continuous Good Standing counted?

ANSWER 2: Starting with the month prior to nomination and the prior twenty three (23) months, all of which must be consecutive.

QUESTION 3: What about a late payment during those twenty-four (24) months?

ANSWER 3: In the case of either a late or missing payment, the member would not be eligible for nomination and election.

QUESTION 4: Does the 24 month continuous good standing provision also apply to nominating or voting in the election?

ANSWER 4: No, you need a minimum of one month good standing; the month prior to the month of nomination (and the month prior to election if nomination and election will be held in different months). A member can restore "good standing" by paying required dues to the duly accredited Secretary-Treasurer prior to the meeting and commencement of nominations or elections.

QUESTION 5: What if I was on Payroll Dues Deduction and the Carrier didn't take my dues?

ANSWER 5: In accordance with Article X, Section 5(c) of the IBT Constitution:

"A member on dues checkoff whose employer fails to make a proper deduction during any month in which the member has earnings from work performed during the month from which the dues could have been deducted, or has earnings from which the employer normally makes a dues deduction pursuant to the contract or established practice, shall not lose good standing status for that month. In such an event, the Local Union shall notify the member of his employer's failure and payment shall be made by the member within (30) days of said notice in order to retain good standing status."

QUESTION 6: Would a BMWED Unemployment Card cover me for months that I was furloughed?

ANSWER 6: No. Under the Teamster's Constitution an Unemployment Card does not count toward the required twenty-four (24) months in calculating Continuous Good Standing.

QUESTION 7: What if I was called up for Active Duty for the military or National Guard, would those months count when I didn't pay dues?

ANSWER 7: Article II, Section 4(a) of the Teamster Constitution states:

“Members in a reserve component of the military or National Guard who are called to active service lasting more than thirty (30) days but not more than twenty-four (24) consecutive months, shall be considered to be on Union approved leave of absence without any further action by the Local Union Executive Board. During such leave, the member shall not be obligated to pay dues beginning with the month in which the member commences his active duty. The member shall notify the Local Union that he has been released from active service within thirty (30) days and will be responsible for paying his dues beginning with the month following the month of release. In the event the member remains in active service after twenty-four (24) months, the member must pay dues for the month following the expiration of the twenty-four (24) month period in order to remain in good standing.”

QUESTION 8: In looking at my dues payment record for the previous twenty-four (24) months, I see one month that shows “LF”, is that OK? Am I eligible to run for office?

ANSWER 8: No. LF means Late Full Dues. A late payment of dues (LF) breaks your Continuous Good Standing. Therefore, a LF would not count in calculating the twenty-four (24) months of Continuous Good Standing.

QUESTION 9: In looking at my dues record for the previous twenty-four (24) months, I see several months at the beginning that show “OF”, is that OK? Am I eligible to run for office?

ANSWER 9: No. OF stands for Officials Fee (Seniority Retention Fees). This fee is different than Full Dues even though it can be the same dollar amount. Persons paying seniority retention fees (OF) do not have full membership rights nor are they deemed to be “actively employed at the craft” as required under Article II, Section 4(a) (1) of the Teamster Constitution.

QUESTION 10: If “LF” and “OF” payments don't count toward the twenty-four (24) months, what other codes don't count?

ANSWER 10: Other codes that don't count are:

F=Fee, **RD**=Retired Dues, **LF**=Late Full Dues, **LU**=Late Unemployment Dues, **AS**=Assessment, **UC**=Unemployment Card, **AF**=Agency Fee, **LRA**=Late Retired Dues & Assessment, **WVA**=Waived Dues & Assessment, **AFA**=Agency Fee & Assessment, **LR**=Late Retired Dues, **WV**=Waived Dues, **DIS**=Dispensation, **OF**=Officials Fee, **OB**=Objector Fee, **RDA**=Retired Dues & Assessment, **EXA**=Exempt Dues & Assessment, **LFA**=Late Full Dues & Assessment, **LUA**=Late Unemployed Dues & Assessments, **OFA**=Officials Fee & Assessment, **OBA**=Objector Fee & Assessment, ----- = missing payment.

QUESTION 11: With all those codes not counting, maybe it would be easier if you told me what codes do count toward the twenty-four (24) month requirement?

ANSWER 11: The codes that would count toward eligibility are:

FDA=Full Dues & Assessment, **FFA**=Fee & Full Dues & Assessment, **FD**=Full Dues, **FF**=Fee & Full Dues, **UD**=Unemployed Dues, and **EX**=Exempt Dues.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you that, in accordance with Article I, Section 5 of the Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employees Division's Bylaws, the Sixth Regular National Division Convention of our Brotherhood will convene at Sheraton Grand Chicago Riverwalk, Chicago, Illinois, at 9:00 a.m., Monday June 22, 2026, for the purpose of reviewing the work and accomplishments of the Brotherhood, to consider legislation for the benefit and advancement of the membership, to amend the National Division Bylaws, to elect officers and to act upon such other business as may properly come before the Convention.

REPRESENTATION

Your attention is directed to Article XVIII, Section 14, Paragraph 1, of the National Division Bylaws, which provides, in pertinent part, that:

"Each Local Lodge in good standing shall be entitled to be represented at the National Division Convention by a delegate or alternate, or a delegate ex officio as set forth in the second paragraph of this Section. However, in the event a Local Lodge elects not to send its own member or delegate ex officio to the National Division Convention, two or more Local Lodges may elect to be represented by a delegate and/or alternate of another Local Lodge in the BMWED from their System Division Federation. No delegate may represent more than five hundred (500) members at the National Division Convention unless such members are all members of one Local Lodge. A delegate or alternate to the National Division Convention may represent as many Lodges as may elect him if the total membership so represented does not exceed five hundred (500) members."

EX OFFICIO DELEGATES

Article XVIII, Section 14, Paragraph 2, of the National Division Bylaws governs the selection of ex officio delegates to the National Division Convention and provides as follows:

"All delegates and alternates to National Division Conventions must be elected by secret ballot vote of the members in good standing of the Local Lodge by which they are accredited to the

Convention; provided, however, that National Division Officers shall be delegates ex officio at all National Division Conventions as set forth in Article 1, Section 6, if they are not elected as a delegate by a Local Lodge; and provided, further, that if a General Chairman or elective full time System Division or Federation Officer is not elected as a delegate by a Local Lodge, such General Chairman or such System Division or Federation Officer when designated by the General Chairman will, by virtue of election to such office, be a delegate ex officio at all National Division Conventions (at no expense to the National Division) and accorded the same rights and privileges enjoyed by National Division Officers who are delegates ex officio as set forth in Article 1, Section 6. When National Division Officers or General Chairmen or full time System Division or Federation Officers are delegates ex officio at National Division Conventions, such Officers will be entitled to cast one vote in all matters before the National Division Convention except election of National Division Officers.”

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR ELECTION AS DELEGATE AND ALTERNATE DELEGATE

Article XVIII, Section 14, Paragraph 3, of the National Division Bylaws sets forth the eligibility requirements to run for delegate and alternate to the National Division Convention:

“All National Division Convention delegates or alternates shall be members in good standing of a Local Lodge in good standing with the National Division, and shall meet the eligibility requirements as set forth in paragraph 4.9 of the Merger Agreement, and be a member in good standing to May 1 of the Convention year.”

Retired Local Lodge Secretary-Treasurers holding such office under the provisions of paragraph 4.11 of the Merger Agreement are **not** eligible to run for delegate or alternate delegate. Retired state Legislative Directors holding such office, and all other BMWED retirees (i.e., those not “actively employed at the craft” as required under Article II, Section 4(a)(1) of the IBT Constitution), are also not eligible to run for delegate or alternate delegate.

ELECTION OF DELEGATES AND ALTERNATE DELEGATES

Article XVIII, Section 14, Paragraphs 2, 4 and 5 of the National Division Bylaws, sets forth the procedures by which delegates and alternates to the National Division Convention are elected:

“All delegates and alternates to National Division Conventions must be elected by secret ballot vote of the members in good standing of the Local Lodge by which they are accredited to the Convention; provided however, that National Division Officers shall be delegates ex officio at all National Division Conventions as set forth in Article 1, Section 6, if they are not elected as a delegate by a Local Lodge; and provided, further, that if a General Chairman or elective full-time System Division or Federation Officer is not elected as a delegate by a Local Lodge, such General Chairman or such System Division or Federation Officer when designated by the General Chairman, will, by virtue of his election to such office, be a delegate ex officio at all National Division Conventions (at no expense to the National Division) and accorded the same rights and privileges enjoyed by National Division Officers who are delegates ex officio as set forth in Article 1, Section 6. When National Division Officers or General Chairmen or full time System Division or Federation Officers are delegates ex officio at National Division Conventions, such Officers will be entitled to cast one vote in all matters before the National Division Convention except election of National Division Officers.”

“Local Lodges shall elect delegates and alternates to the National Division Convention at a meeting held on or after January 1 of the year in which the Convention convenes. Provided, however, that Local Lodges that do not ordinarily meet between January 1 and May 1 may conduct such elections during the

second half of the year prior to the year in which the convention convenes. All members in good standing of the Local Lodge will be given at least fifteen (15) days advance notice in writing at their last known addresses of the date, time and place at which election shall be held. The National Division Secretary-Treasurer will be advised of the results of such elections in ample time for this information to be recorded at the National Division. All expenses of said delegates shall be paid by Local Lodge or Lodges represented.”

“The alternate will take the place of the delegate in case the delegate is unable to serve.”

ISSUANCE OF CREDENTIALS

Article XVIII, Section 14, Paragraph 6, of the National Division Bylaws describes the manner in which Credentials will be issued to delegates and alternates to the National Division Convention:

“Credentials shall be issued to the Secretary-Treasurers of Local Lodges prior to January 1 of the year of the National Division Convention. Credentials must be signed by an elected officer of that Local Lodge. In the event that there is not a Local Lodge Officer present, a System Division or Federation Officer may sign the credential. Original credentials shall be given to the duly elected delegates. Duplicate credentials shall be forwarded to the National Division Secretary-Treasurer’s office as soon as possible after the election of the delegates.”

DELEGATE VOTING STRENGTH

Article XVIII, Section 14, Paragraph 7, of the National Division Bylaws prescribes the method by which delegate voting strength will be determined:

“Representative votes for each delegate shall be determined in accordance with National Division records twenty (20) days prior to the opening of the Convention, and shall reflect all members in good standing as of May 1 of that year. No votes shall be added and no duplicate credentials shall be accepted after twenty (20) days prior to the opening of the Convention.

PROHIBITION AGAINST THE TRANSFER OF VOTES OR CREDENTIALS

You should be advised that the transfer of votes between delegates will **not** be permitted at the 2026 National Division Convention and that under Article XVIII, Section 14, Paragraph 1 of the National Division Bylaws, no delegate may represent more than five hundred (500) members unless the members are all members of one Local Lodge. Only members in good standing are counted in arriving at a Lodge’s voting strength.

Therefore, care should be exercised in those instances where a member is elected as a delegate representing more than one Local Lodge with combined membership in excess of five hundred (500). Any delegate present at the Convention who was elected as the delegate for more than one Local Lodge will be required to register as the delegate for all such Lodges and will **not** be permitted to transfer his/her credential to an alternate for such Local Lodge(s), even though the alternate is in attendance and the delegate may be carrying in excess of five hundred (500) votes.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS TO VOTE IN LODGE ELECTIONS

Only members in good standing are entitled to vote in the election of a delegate or alternate to the National Division Convention. Retired Local Lodge Secretary-Treasurers holding such office and paying

full dues under the provisions of Paragraph 4.11 of the Merger Agreement are also entitled to nominate, second, and vote in the election for delegate and alternate to the National Division Convention.

Retired members who are paying full dues, retiree dues of \$16.00 per year, or National Division dues to protect their death benefit, are **not** eligible to vote in Lodge elections. Members who have secured a Withdrawal Card after leaving the service of the railroad, being promoted to an official and/or excepted position with the railroad or transferring to another craft, or who are considered an agency or objector fee payer, are not eligible to participate in the election of a delegate or alternate to the National Division Convention even if they are paying full dues.

FIFTEEN-DAY ADVANCE WRITTEN NOTICE REQUIRED

The National Division Bylaws requires that advance written notice by mail to the membership be given of the holding of a meeting for the purpose of nominating and electing delegates and alternates to the National Division Convention at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date of their nomination and election. In calculating the 15-day period, the day the cards are mailed is not counted, but the day of the meeting is counted.

The “Notice of Meeting Card” (Form F-86) must be mailed to all members who are eligible to participate in the election at their last known address. The posting of meeting notices on bulletin boards, tool sheds, etc., or their distribution to members of gangs at the work site, does not satisfy the notice requirements.

If you provide National Division or your System Office with sufficient advance notice of the date of your meeting, National Division will furnish you with address labels or Notice of Meeting Cards with pre-printed addresses. Prior to mailing, you should check the addresses against your current membership records to ensure that all members receive a notice of the meeting, since it may be necessary to hand-address cards for members for whom addresses were not furnished. Addresses for those members who are deceased or individuals who are no longer members of the Brotherhood should be discarded.

QUORUM REQUIRED TO ELECT DELEGATE AND ALTERNATE

Article XVIII, Section 6, Paragraph 3, of the National Division Bylaws provides that five (5) members in good standing constitute a quorum for the purpose of transacting Lodge business. Therefore, if there are not five (5) members in good standing present at your Lodge meeting which has been designated to elect a delegate and alternate to the National Division Convention, it will be necessary to reschedule the election due to the fact that a quorum was not present.

SECRET BALLOT ELECTION

Article XVIII, Section 14, Paragraph 2, of the National Division Bylaws, requires that all delegates and alternates **must** be elected by secret ballot. This is also a requirement of the Labor Management Reporting and Disclosure Act of 1959 and must be adhered to.

MAILING OF CREDENTIALS

Article XVIII, Section 14, Paragraph 6 of the National Division Bylaws requires Credentials to be issued and mailed from the National Division in sufficient time to be in the hands of Local Lodge’s Secretary-Treasurers prior to January 1 of the year of the National Division Convention. Your respective Local Lodge’s Credential is enclosed.

Early election by the Local Lodges of delegates and alternates is requested in order that the duplicate credentials are received by the National Division Secretary-Treasurer from the Lodge Secretary-Treasurers, twenty (20) days prior to Convention (June 3, 2026).

PROPOSALS TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION

Article XX, Section 1, of the National Division Bylaws, provides that all proposals to alter or amend the National Division Bylaws which are printed in the BMWED *JOURNAL* thirty (30) days before the day the Convention begins, may be enacted by a majority vote of the delegates assembled at the National Division Convention. Therefore, to comply with this requirement, all proposed amendments to the National Division Bylaws that are to be published in the BMWED *JOURNAL* must reach the National Division not later than March 31, 2026. In the case of proposed amendments to the National Division Bylaws which are not published in the BMWED *JOURNAL*, the approval of three-fourths of the delegates is necessary for their adoption.

It is not necessary that resolutions other than those proposing to alter or amend the National Division Bylaws be printed in the BMWED *JOURNAL*. However, such resolutions should be submitted in advance so the Resolution Committee can consider them before the Convention convenes and submit a report to the Convention.


All proposals to amend the National Division Bylaws and all resolutions that are to be considered by the Resolutions Committee should be mailed to the National Division President.

CRAFT MEETS CARGO: THE BMWED CARPENTERS OF LAKE SUPERIOR'S ORE DOCKS

BMWED members provide some of the most unique and knowledgeable work on the railroad. One such job is that of the structures carpenters at the Iron Ore Docks up and around Lake Superior.

The Structures Carpenters at the Iron Ore Docks are involved in the daily maintenance of the Conveyer System, the Ship Loader, repairs to buildings and rail changes on the dock. The qualifications needed to work are as follows: Fall Protection, Confined Space Entry, Bridge Welder Certification, Forklift Truck Operator, Lead awareness.

The Conveyer System involves replacing idler rollers, frames, hopper repair, pulleys, alignment of gearboxes, motors and adjusting belt travel. Also, fabricating new parts or repairing existing structure in the system is a required skill. The pulleys that are replaced weigh over 13,000 pounds.

The Stacker, which is used to stockpile iron ore on the ground at the facility, is also maintained by Structures Carpenter. Stacker maintenance includes idler rollers, frame, hoppers, pulleys, alignment of gearboxes, motors and belt adjustments. The Stacker also has steel wheels that travel on rail and drive motors that must be repaired or replaced.

The Ship Loader is also maintained by the Structures Carpenter. The Ship Loader is a series of cradles or booms that lower above the boat and then extend a shuttle or conveyer over the boat to load iron. Maintenance includes idler rollers, frames, hopper repair and adjusting belt travel.

While all work performed by BMWED members is highly-skilled and valuable, some jobs, like those on the Iron Ore Docks, are relatively unique and specialized. "I've been workin' on the railroad" takes on many different forms!

The Brotherhood, and all of Rail Labor for that matter, lost a tremendous ally, Brother, and friend in July.

Brother Ron Friend, who spearheaded the truly grassroots effort to reduce the Railroad Retirement age to 60, bring the surviving spouse annuity to a full 100 percent following the passing of a qualified railroader, and decrease the age of eligibility for pension benefits from 10 years to 5, passed away at his life-long home in Marietta, Ohio July 13.

“Ron is a stellar example of how a rank-and-file member, with a far-fetched idea to make things better for everyone, can accomplish monumental improvements,” BMWED United Passenger Rail Federation Vice Chairman/Secretary-Treasurer and friend of Brother Ron Gene Anirina Sr. said. “It goes to show how locals, joining together and passing resolutions, can be the start of positive changes.”

Brother Ron retired from CSX-T after a 40-year railroading career. He was a proud member of BMWED Allied Federation Local Lodge 1509, but it was his determined work that culminated in the passage of the Railroad Retirement and Survivors’ Improvement Act of 2001 that was his lasting legacy and reached much farther than just his local lodge. Brother Anirina remembers how Brother Ron took it upon himself as just a rank-and-file member to rally the support for the effort from the ground up, and how inspiring it was.

“Penn Fed Local 3014 and the rest of our Federation joined the fight with him,” Brother Anirina said. “The BMWED national joined the fight after the members passed a resolution at local meetings and finally the national convention. But, make no mistake, it all started with Ron and his tenacity to accomplish what others said couldn’t be done. It was a pleasure to know him. He will be missed.”

Brother Ron Friend was a veteran of both the U.S. Navy and Army Reserves. He is survived by his wife of more than 50 years, Deborah, his daughter Lori, and granddaughter Railyn. The Brotherhood sends along our deepest and most sincere condolences.

An unheralded but indisputable leader, Brother Ron Friend will be greatly missed.

OBJECTION PROCEDURES FOR EXPENDITURES NOT GERMANE TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

represented by the Brotherhood, and who has elected to become an agency fee payer may become an objector to expenditures not related to collective bargaining, contract administration, or other chargeable expenditures. An agency fee payer, who elects to become an objector through these procedures, shall pay a fee calculated in accordance with Section 5 of this Policy.

Sec. 2. To become an objector, an employee represented by the Brotherhood, shall notify the National Division Secretary-Treasurer of his or her objection in a separate envelope by certified mail postmarked during the month of March each year. An employee who desires to object but is unable to make a timely objection because he or she is not subject to a Union Shop Agreement in March must make an objection within thirty (30) days after becoming subject to Union Shop obligations and receiving notice of these procedures. The objection shall be signed and shall contain the objector's current home address and the Subordinate Lodge number, if known. The objector shall keep the Brotherhood informed of any change in address. Objections may only be made by individual employes; no petition objections will be honored.

Sec. 3. The following categories are examples of chargeable expenditures to the extent permitted by law:

- a. All expenses concerning the negotiation of agreements, practices and working conditions;
- b. All expenses concerning the administration of agreements, practices and working conditions, including grievance handling, all activities related to arbitration, and discussion with employes in the bargaining unit or employer representatives regarding working conditions, benefits and contract rights;
- c. Convention expenses and other normal union internal governance and management expenses;
- d. Social activities and union business meeting expenses;
- e. Publication expenses to the extent coverage is related to chargeable activities;
- f. Litigation expenses related to contract administration, collective bargaining rights and internal governance;
- g. Expenses for legislative and administrative agency activities closely related to the negotiation of administration of contracts and working conditions;
- h. All expenses for the education and training of members, Officers and staff intended to prepare the participants to better perform chargeable activities;
- i. All strike fund expenditures and other costs of group cohesion and economic action, e.g., demonstrations, general strike activity, informational picketing and the like;
- j. A proportional portion of all overhead and administrative expenses.

Sec. 4. In the first quarter of each year, the Brotherhood shall publish these policies and procedures in the Journal to provide notice to employes represented by the Brotherhood of their right to object and the procedures for objecting. The Brotherhood shall also send a copy of these policies and procedures to each person who objected the previous year to inform the person of his or her right to renew the objection for the current year.

Sec. 5. The Brotherhood shall retain a neutral auditor to perform an independent audit of the records of the Brotherhood and to submit an annual report for the purpose of determining the percentage of expenditures that fall within the categories specified in Section 3. The amount of the expenditures during the previous fiscal year that fall within Section 3 shall be the basis for calculating the reduced dues or fees and assessments that must be paid by the objector for the current fiscal year.

Sec. 6. The neutral auditor shall complete the report for each fiscal year. This report shall include an analysis of the major categories of union expenses attributable to chargeable and non-chargeable activities. A copy of the neutral auditor's report shall be sent to each person who made an objection in the current previous year.

Sec. 7. Each person entitled to receive the audit report may challenge the legal and arithmetic bases of the calculations in the neutral auditor's report by filing an appeal with the National Division Secretary-Treasurer. Such appeal must be made by sending a signed letter to the Secretary-Treasurer postmarked no later than thirty (30) days after the date that the audit report was mailed.

Sec. 8. All appeals received by the union within the time limits specified above shall be determined by expeditious referral to an impartial arbitrator chosen through the rules of the American Arbitration Association (AAA) for the impartial determination of union fees. The Brotherhood shall notify the AAA that challenges to the calculation of its fees and assessments have been received from one or more persons and include the names and addresses of the persons who filed the appeals and who must be notified of the proceedings. Thereupon, in accordance with its rules, the AAA will appoint an arbitrator and notify the Brotherhood and the challenger. In addition, the following rules shall apply:

- a. All appeals shall be consolidated and heard as soon as the AAA can schedule the arbitration and shall be at a location selected by the AAA to be the most convenient for those involved in the proceeding.
- b. Each party to the arbitration shall bear its, or their own, costs. The challengers shall have the option of paying a pro rata portion of the arbitrator's fees and expenses. The balance of such fees and expenses shall be paid by the Brotherhood.
- c. Challengers may, at their expense, be represented by counsel or another representative of their choice. Challengers need not appear at the hearing and shall be permitted to file written statements with the arbitrator instead of appearing. Such statements shall be filed no later than the beginning of the hearing before the arbitrator. Post-hearing statements may be filed in accordance with the provisions of Section 8(g).

d. Fourteen (14) days prior to the start of the arbitration, challengers shall be provided with copies of all exhibits or a list of all such exhibits intended to be introduced at the arbitration by the Brotherhood and a list of all witnesses the Brotherhood intends to call, except for exhibits and witnesses the Brotherhood may introduce for rebuttal. When a list of exhibits has been provided, any challenger shall have a right to receive copies of such exhibits by making a written request for them to the National Division Secretary-Treasurer. Additionally, copies of all exhibits shall be available for inspection and copying at the hearing.

e. A court reporter shall make a transcript of all proceedings before the arbitrator. This transcript shall be the official record of the proceedings and may be purchased by the challengers. If challengers do not purchase a copy of the transcript, a copy shall be available for inspection by challengers at the National Division during normal business hours.

f. The arbitrator shall have control over all procedural matters affecting the arbitration in order to fulfill the dual needs of an informed and expeditious arbitration. The arbitrator shall set forth in the decision the legal and arithmetic bases for the decision, giving full consideration to the legal requirements limiting the amount that objectors may be charged.

g. The parties to the arbitration shall have the right to file a post-hearing statement within fifteen (15) days after both parties have completed submission of their cases at the hearing. Such statements may not introduce new evidence or discuss evidence not introduced in the arbitration. The arbitrator shall issue a decision within forty-five (45) days after the final date for submission of post-hearing statements or within such other reasonable period as is consistent with the AAA rules and the requirements of law.

h. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on all findings of fact supported by substantial evidence on the record considered as a whole and on other findings legally permitted to be binding on all parties.

i. Upon receipt of the arbitrator's award, any adjustment in favor of the challenger will be made from the Union escrow account. Any adjustments in favor of the union shall be due and owing within thirty (30) days. An individual failing to pay any adjustments in full within the prescribed thirty-day period will be considered as being in non-compliance with provisions of the Union Shop Agreement.

Sec. 9. The National Division Officers will have the authority to amend this policy, as it deems appropriate.

Sec. 10. The provisions of this procedure shall be considered legally separable. Should any provision or portion be held contrary to law by a court of an arbitrator, the remaining provisions or portions thereof shall continue to be legally effective and binding.
